The world premiere of *We Crazy, Right?*, written and performed by Jeff Seabaugh and directed by Mary Tarochione, will be presented as part of the 16th annual New York International Fringe Festival – FringeNYC. Toss together two, gay white guys, three Dominican kids, gay marriage, foster care and adoption. You get a June Cleaver wannabe stay-at-home dad battling his inner Roseanne. You don't want to miss this recipe for the new, modern family.

In his second solo show, Jeff Seabaugh tells the tale of his journey navigating the tricky waters of the New York City foster care system to become an adoptive father of three, and his decision to leave his life in the City to become the sole gay, stay-at-home dad in his suburban Westchester town.

Seabaugh performed his solo show *How to Make an American Family* as part of the 2010 Midtown International Theatre Festival. NYTheatre.com called Seabaugh's writing "rich and funny and compassionate" and his acting "superb," summarizing the show as "a warm and wise tour-de-force...exquisite theatre...a splendid solo show." Additionally, he has performed with the National Shakespeare Company, American Globe Theatre, Jean Cocteau Repertory, and Ensemble Studio Theatre. He has directed off-Broadway and regionally, and was co-founder of the off-off-Broadway company NativeAliens Theatre Collective, where his first play, *In My Dreams*, premiered.
